Features

Your Radio Shack 5-In-One Learning Light-Up Remote allows you to control your TV, VCR, cable/SAT/DSS converter, DVD player, and an auxiliary device with one easy-to-use remote control.

Its features include:

Learning — stores and recalls additional remote control functions

Sleep Timer — lets you program your TV or cable/satellite system to turn itself off

Extensive Searchable Code Library — contains remote control codes for most available brands, including discontinued devices

Channel Scan — lets you "channel surf" all available channels

Favorite Channel Scan — lets you select only your favorite channels to "surf"

Programmable Power Key — controls master on/off of home entertainment devices with a single key press

Programmable Macro Keys — allow instant tuning to favorite channels

Mode Reassignment — lets you add control of another TV, VCR, DVD player or other auxiliary device in place of an existing device

Powerful Infrared Beam — lets you operate your home entertainment devices from a greater distance than with many of the original remote controls

Illuminated Keypad — provides easy-to-read remote control operation in low light

Non-Volatile Memory — retains stored device codes and any programmed settings when batteries are low or must be replaced

☐ A Quick Look at the Keys

Your Radio Shack 5-In-One Learning Light-Up Remote controls the most-used functions on your TV, VCR, cable/SAT/DSS converter, DVD player, and an auxiliary device.

After you set up the remote control, its command keys will work like the keys on your original remote controls. For example, depending on the device you select (TV, VCR, CBL/SAT, DVD, or AUX) **POWER** will operate just like the POWER ON/OFF key on the remote control for your original TV, VCR, cable/SAT/DSS, DVD player, or auxiliary device.

The following table lists all keys and how they function.

Key	Function
P	Use to program the remote control. The P key is slightly recessed to avoid accidental programming changes. You might need to use a pointed device, such as a ballpoint pen, to apply sufficient pressure.
Light Key	Use to turn the backlight on or off. When on, any key press activates the backlight. It stays on for up to 5 seconds after the last key press.
TV, VCR, CBL/SAT, and DVD	Use to set up the remote control to replace the devices' original remote controls. In normal operation, use to remotely select a desired device to control.
POWER, VOL +, VOL -, CH +, CH-, LAST, MUTE, ENTER, Digit Keys, Transport Keys, +100, and TV/VCR (A/B)	Use the same as the corresponding keys on the original remote controls. POWER can also be programmed for ALL POWER on/off of selected devices (see "Programming the Power Key" on Page 13).

Key	Function
MENU, GUIDE, INFO, and EXIT	Use to view interactive menus for TV, VCR, CBL/SAT, and DVD.
MUSIC, MOVIES, SPORTS, and NEWS	Use to program instant tuning of up to three channels per category (see "Programming Macros" on Page 12).
SCAN (FAV)	Use to scan all or only favorite channels (see "Using Channel Scan" on Page 17 and "Using Favorite Channel Scan" on Page 17).

The following table explains how selected keys function in different modes. For example, **CH+** acts as a Channel-Up key in TV, VCR, and CBL/SAT modes. However, in DVD mode, **CH+** acts as a Skip Forward key.

^{*} On some cable/satellite remote controls, **REW** and **FF** do not punch through to VCR transport control. Instead, these keys act as Page Up and Page Down, respectively.

Preparation

After installing the batteries (not included), you can immediately use the remote (with its factory-programmed settings) to control an RCA TV, VCR, and DIRECTV receiver, as well as a Pioneer DVD player and auxiliary device. To control other brands, you must perform some simple programming to overwrite the default parameters.

For best results, read and perform all remaining instructions. Also, keep these instructions for future reference.

If you experience any difficulties programming your remote, call customer service at 888-631-9859.

INSTALLING BATTERIES

Your remote requires four AAA batteries (not supplied) for power. For the best performance and longest life, we recommend RadioShack alkaline batteries.

Cautions:

- Use only fresh batteries of the required size and recommended type.
- · Do not use rechargeable batteries.
- Do not mix old and new batteries or different types of batteries (standard or alkaline).
- Always remove old or weak batteries. Batteries can leak chemicals that can destroy electronic parts.

Note: Do not press any of the remote control's keys while installing batteries.

Follow these steps to install batteries.

- Press the battery compartment cover's tab and lift off the cover.
- 2. Place the batteries in the compartment as indicated by the polarity symbols (+ and –) marked inside.
- 3. Replace the cover.

When batteries become low, the remote control stops operating to protect stored settings. Replacing the batteries with new ones restores full functionality and does not require you to reprogram your remote control.

Warning: Dispose of old batteries promptly and properly. Do not burn or bury them.

Caution: If you do not plan to use the remote for a month or longer, remove the batteries. Batteries can leak chemicals that can destroy electronic parts.

DEVICE TYPES

You can use the remote control's device keys to control the following types of devices:

TV — TV

VCR — VCR or PVR (Personal Video Recorder)

CBL/SAT — Cable converter or SAT/DSS receiver

DVD — DVD or LD Player

AUX — Amplifier, tuner or other audio device

SETTING UP YOUR REMOTE

To control devices other than the default brands (for example, an RCA TV, VCR, and DIRECTV receiver, a Pioneer DVD player and auxiliary device), perform the following steps. If you use the default brand devices, skip this section.

1. Refer to "Manufacturers' Codes" on Page 23 and write down the code(s) for the brand of each device you want to program on the supplied label.

Note: Some manufacturers may have several codes listed. Try each until you find the right one. If you cannot find the correct code, see "Using Manual Code Search" on Page 20.

2. Turn on all your home entertainment devices.

On the remote control, press the desired device key (TV, VCR, CBL/SAT, DVD, or AUX).

Note: For TV/VCR combinations, press **VCR** and use the VCR code listed for your model under "TV-VCR Combo Codes" on Page 38. If your TV/VCR combination also lists a TV code, you must program the TV separately by repeating Steps 3–5 to add volume control. In Step 3, press **TV**, then in step 4 enter the TV code.

4. Hold down P until the remote's red light blinks twice, then release P and enter the first 4-digit manufacturer's code for the desired device. When the red light blinks twice, the remote control has accepted the code.

For example, to set up the remote control of a Panasonic TV (manufacturer's code 0051), press TV, hold down P until the red light blinks twice, release P and press 0 0 5 1.

Note: If you entered the code incorrectly, the red light emits one long blink.

5. Point the remote control at the desired device and press **POWER**. The device should turn off.

If the remote control does not operate your device, try the other codes listed in "Manufacturers' Codes" for your type and brand of device. Otherwise, use the search method to find a working code — see "Using Manual Code Search" on Page 20.

6. Repeat Steps 2–5 to program other devices.

Note: If the remote control does not operate all device functions, try using another code in the list that may be more compatible.

PROGRAMMING FAVORITE CHANNEL SCAN

Once you have programmed channels into a favorite channel table, you can scan up to ten favorite channels for a desired device.

Note: Once you have programmed **SCAN/FAV** for Favorite Channel Scan, you cannot use it for Channel Scan unless you reset it (see "Resetting Scan").

- 1. Select TV or CBL/SAT for the favorite channel scan.
- 2. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 3. Press 9 9 6 to start the program.
- 4. Enter the two-, three- or four-digit number for your favorite channel.
- 5. If you entered less than four digits, you must do one of the following: if your original remote requires you to press Enter or Select to send a command, then do so after entering the digits of your favorite channel. If your original remote does not require you to press Enter or Select to send a command, then after entering your two- or three-digit channel number, press P.
 - If you entered a four-digit channel number, do not press P.
- Repeat Steps 4–5 up to nine more times to store another favorite channel for the same device, or exit the program by pressing P until the red light blinks twice.

Note: Upon entering the 10th channel, the remote exits the Favorite Channel Programming mode.

Programming Favorite Channel Scan for a second device deletes the programming for the first.

Resetting Scan

Once you have programmed **SCAN/FAV** for Favorite Channel Scan, you cannot use it for Channel Scan unless you reset it.

To reset SCAN/FAV, follow these steps.

- 1. Select either TV or CBL/SAT.
- 2. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.

- Press 9 9 6. You can now use the remote for Channel Scan (see "Using Channel Scan" on Page 17).
- 4. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.

PROGRAMMING MACROS

Your remote has four macro keys (MUSIC, MOVIES, SPORTS, and NEWS) that you can use to store up to three channels per macro key for instant tuning of TV or cable/satellite channels. For example, if your favorite sports channel on your cable service is 061, you can store it as an instant tune-in macro.

Follow these steps to program macros.

- 1. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 2. Press 9 9 5 to start the program.
- Press the desired macro key (MUSIC, MOVIES, SPORTS, or NEWS).
- Press CBL/SAT or TV to select the appropriate device.
- 5. Press the numbers for the desired channel (for example, for the sports channel in the previous example press 0 6 1 or 0 0 6 1).

Note: If your original remote control requires you to press Enter or Select to send a command, press Enter or Select after entering your three- or four-digit channel number.

Hold down P until the red light blinks twice to save the setting.

If you want to add two more channels to the macro keys, repeat Steps 1–6 twice, each time substituting another channel number in step 5.

Note: You can only program three channels for each macro key. Programming more than three channels will overwrite one or more of your original channel settings.

PROGRAMMING THE POWER KEY

Your remote can store a power on/off sequence to control the power of up to four devices with a single key press. Once the desired sequence is stored, **POWER** acts as a master power key when held down for at least 2 seconds.

Follow these steps to program the power key.

- 1. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 2. Press 9 9 5 to start the program.
- 3. Press **POWER** to select the power key.
- Press the device keys (TV, VCR, CBL/SAT, DVD, and AUX) in the desired order.
- 5. Hold down **P** until the red light blinks twice to accept the program.

Resetting the Power Key

Follow these steps to reset the Power key to the default settings (delete the master power setup):

- 1. Hold down P until red light blinks twice.
- 2. Press 9 9 5.
- 3. Press POWER.
- 4. Hold down P until red light blinks twice.

REASSIGNING DEVICES

Although your remote is designed to control a TV, a VCR, a cable converter (or SAT receiver), a DVD player and an auxiliary device, you can reassign an unused device key (for example, **AUX**) to control another device, such as a second VCR.

- 1. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 2. Press 9 9 2 to start the program.

- 3. Press the device key for the device you are adding (for example, VCR) then press the device key for the unused key where the additional device will be assigned (for example, AUX). The red light blinks twice to accept the reassignment.
- 4. Set up the reassigned key to control your device (see "Setting Up Your Remote" on Page 9).

Note: Other reassignments are possible, including adding a second TV or second DVD player to an unused device key. Simply repeat Step 3 with your desired choices.

Resetting Reassigned Device Keys

If you have reassigned a key (for example, you reassigned the DVD key to operate a second VCR), and want to return to the default setting (for the example, DVD mode), follow these steps.

- 1. Hold down P until red light blinks twice.
- 2. Enter 992.
- Press the desired mode key (the key you want reassigned to factory default settings) twice. The red light blinks twice.

You can now set up codes for the original device.

PROGRAMMING LEARNING

You can program almost any key on your remote to learn a function that is unique to your home entertainment devices (for example, Tracking Up or Down for a VCR).

Note: Please have your original remote controls handy before beginning learning programming.

Important: Be sure to press each key within 10 seconds of the previous entry. If not, the remote control exits programming.

Learning Functions

Do not use the following keys for learning: device keys, P, SLEEP, SCAN, LIGHT, MUSIC, MOVIES, SPORTS, NEWS, or RECORD.

Follow these steps to learn functions from other remotes.

- 1. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 2. Press 9 7 5. The red light blinks twice.
- Press the device key that corresponds with the desired remote (TV, VCR, CBL/SAT, DVD, or AUX).
- 4. Press the key (on the 5-In-One Remote) selected to learn the new feature. The red light blinks rapidly.
- Place the device's original remote control head-tohead (about 2 inches apart) with the 5-In-One Remote.
- On the original remote control, hold down the key to be learned until the red light on the 5-in-One Remote blinks twice.

If the red light does not blink twice, stop and repeat Steps 1–5.

To learn functions on another key, repeat Steps 3-6.

To lock in new feature(s) on the 5-in-One Remote, hold down **P** until the red light blinks twice.

To test a new feature, press the device key on the original remote control that was learned. Then press the key on the 5-In-One Remote that learned the device's feature.

Deleting a Learned Function

- On the 5-In-One Remote, hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 2. Press 9 7 6. The red light blinks twice.
- Press the device key that corresponds with the device's remote control from which the 5-In-One

learned the function (TV, VCR, CBL/SAT, DVD, or AUX).

- Press the key for the learned function you want to delete twice. The LED blinks twice after the second press.
- To clear additional functions stored on other keys, repeat Steps 1–4.

Operation

Note: The command keys on the 5-In-One Remote work the same as the keys on your original remote controls. However, the labeling may be different.

USING THE REMOTE

Once you have completed programming your remote (see "Preparation" on Page 8), you are ready to use your 5-In-One Remote.

- Point the remote at the desired device and press the device key (TV, VCR, CBL/SAT, DVD, or AUX). Then press POWER to turn on the device.
- 2. Press the desired command keys.
- 3. Repeat Steps 1 and 2 for all other devices you want to operate.
- To turn off the last device you selected, press POWER.

To turn off another device, press the device key, then press **POWER**. Repeat this step to turn off all devices.

Note: You can program **POWER** as a master power key to turn all devices on and off in a sequence. See "Programming the Power Key" on Page 13.

USING THE LIGHT

Your remote has a backlight so you can see the keys in the dark. To turn on the light, press $\Rightarrow^{\leftarrow}_{k}$ at the top right of the remote.

When you press a key, the remote lights for a few seconds. To turn off the light, press $\frac{1}{2}$ again.

USING CHANNEL SCAN

Important: If you have set up **SCAN/FAV** for Favorite Channel Scan, you cannot use Channel Scan until you have reset **SCAN/FAV** (see "Resetting Scan" on Page 11).

If you want to view a sample of every channel on your cable or SAT/DSS service, press **CBL/SAT**, then press **SCAN/FAV**. Starting with the current channel, the remote control tunes to each channel in ascending order every three seconds. Press any key to stop the scan.

Note: For on-air broadcast scans, press **TV**, then press **SCAN/FAV** to start the scan.

USING FAVORITE CHANNEL SCAN

To scan favorite channels, you must first program the favorite channel table (see "Programming Favorite Channel Scan" on Page 10).

Press the desired device key (TV or CBL/SAT), then press SCAN/FAV. The remote tunes to each favorite channel in ascending order every three seconds. Press any key to stop the scan.

USING MACROS

Press the desired macro key once for the first channel you programmed (see "Programming Macros" on Page 12), twice for the second channel, and so on.

USING THE POWER KEY

To turn on all devices, hold down **POWER** for at least 2 seconds. Each device turns on in the sequence you pro-

grammed (see "Programming the Power Key" on Page 13).

To turn off all devices, hold down **POWER** for at least 2 seconds. You should see each device turn off in sequence.

Note: If you do not hold down **POWER** for 2 seconds, only the current device turns off. To turn off all devices, you must hold down **POWER**.

CHANGING VOLUME LOCK

Your remote's Volume Lock is preset so the volume and mute keys only control the TV volume, no matter what device is selected. If you want the remote to control the TV's volume only, skip this section and leave the original settings intact.

However, if you want to control another device's volume functions (for example, CBL/SAT, VCR, DVD, or AUX) upon its selection, then perform the steps listed in the applicable section below.

Volume Unlock on a Cable Convertor or SAT/DSS Receiver

- 1. Press CBL/SAT.
- 2. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 3. Press 9 9 3.
- 4. Press VOL-. The red light blinks four times.

Volume Unlock on a VCR

- 1. Press VCR.
- 2. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 3. Press 9 9 3.
- 4. Press VOL-. The red light blinks four times.

Volume Unlock on a DVD

- 1. Press DVD.
- 2. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 3. Press 993.
- 4. Press VOL-. The red light blinks four times.

Volume Unlock on an Auxiliary Device

- 1. Press AUX.
- 2. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 3. Press 993.
- 4. Press VOL-. The red light blinks four times.

Resetting Volume Lock to the Original Settings

- 1. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 2. Press 993.
- 3. Press TV. The red light blinks twice.

USING THE SLEEP TIMER

On a TV or CBL/SAT device, the Sleep Timer lets you program the chosen device to turn itself off. You can set the Sleep Timer in 15-minute increments, for up to 60 minutes.

Setting the Sleep Timer

- 1. Select a device for the sleep timer (TV or CBL/SAT).
- Press SLEEP once to active the Sleep Timer for 15 minutes. The red light blinks once, and then continues to blink once every 15 seconds, to indicate that the Sleep Timer is activated.

- Press SLEEP again within 10 seconds to add another 15 minutes to the sleep time. Repeat as desired up to a maximum of 60 minutes.
- To deactivate the Sleep Timer, press any key. The red light stops blinking.

Locking/Unlocking the Sleep Timer

The 5-in-One Remote's built-in sleep function can be enabled even if another device has a sleep device. Simply lock the Sleep Timer to ensure it functions.

- 1. Select a device for the sleep timer (TV or CBL/SAT).
- 2. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 3. Press 9 7 0.
- The red light blinks twice when the Sleep Timer is locked. (If you are unlocking the Sleep Timer, the red light blinks four times.)

USING MANUAL CODE SEARCH

If your home entertainment device does not respond to remote control commands after trying all of the codes listed for your brand, or if your brand is not listed, try searching for your code.

Follow these steps to search for codes manually.

- 1. Turn on the desired device.
- On the 5-In-One Remote, press the appropriate device key once.
- 3. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 4. Press 9 9 1. The red light blinks twice.
- Aim the 5-In-One Remote at the desired device and slowly alternate between pressing POWER and the appropriate device key. Stop when the device turns off — a code that works has been found.

Note: In the search mode, the remote sends IR codes from its extensive library to the selected

device, starting with the most popular codes. Because of the library's size, this procedure may take some time. When the red light blinks three times, the search of every code is complete.

6. Press P once to lock in the code.

Note: If the device turns off during the search, but does not operate after you lock in the code, begin the search again, pausing longer between key presses.

Checking Your Code

If you set up the remote control using the manual code search procedure, you can use the following instructions to find out what code is operating your equipment:

- On the remote control, press the desired device key once.
- 2. Hold down P until the red light blinks twice.
- 3. Press 9 9 0. The red light blinks twice.
- To view the code for the first digit, press 1. Count the number of blinks (for example, if there are three blinks, the first digit is 3) and write down the number.

Note: The red light will not blink if the code digit is a "0".

5. Repeat Step 4 three more times for each successive digit by pressing and releasing 2, 3, and then 4.

Troubleshooting

- The P button is slightly recessed to avoid accidental programming changes. You might need to use a pointed device, such as a ballpoint pen, to apply sufficient pressure.
- If the remote control stops working after you have successfully tested the control for each device, or if you are unable to get the remote control to work at all, do the following:
- Be sure you press the device key for the device you want to control before you press any other key.
- Confirm that your IR devices are working properly by using the original remote control or the manual controls.
- · Replace the batteries.

CARE

Keep the remote dry; if it gets wet, wipe it dry immediately. Use and store the remote only in normal temperature environments. Handle the remote carefully; do not drop it. Keep the remote away from dust and dirt, and wipe it with a damp cloth occasionally to keep it looking new.

Modifying or tampering with the remote's internal components can cause a malfunction and might invalidate its warranty. If your remote is not performing as it should, take it to your local RadioShack store for assistance.

☐ Manufacturers' Codes

The following lists tell you which 4-digit codes to enter to set up the 5-In-One Remote Learning Light-Up Remote.

Notes:

- The remote control might not have every command featured on your original remote controls.
- Use the supplied label to record the manufacturers' codes for your remote-controlled devices.
- A key on the remote control that has the same name as a key on your original remote control may have a slightly different function.
